Sport is a popular option at KS5, where students have the opportunity to study a BTEC National Extended Certificate or Diploma in Sport.

The philosophy of the department is that a student of Physical Education engages in activities that will develop personal health and fitness, confidence, leadership qualities, team work and skill. They experience a range of physical activity and sports in an individual and team setting whilst gaining the opportunity to represent and compete for The Academy.
